

DUF 2022 HEALTH & SAFETY PROTOCOLS

*These guidelines are subject to change, based on CA State and County guidelines

To keep our guests, volunteers, vendors, maestros, and performers as safe as possible, we have implemented the following policies:

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

At DUF 2022, we are requiring all participants (applies to ALL guests, volunteers, vendors, maestros, and performers) entering the festival to either:

1. Provide proof that they are fully vaccinated against COVID-19. You can access your vaccination record direct to your phone at <https://myvaccinerecord.cdph.ca.gov>

OR

2. Provide proof of a negative COVID-19 PCR test, taken within 48 hours of the day you are attending the festival (we recommend getting tested on 4/6/2022) or Rapid Antigen test 24 hours before the first day of the festival (test must be taken on 4/7/2022) **NO HOME KITS WILL BE ACCEPTED (I.E BINAX NOW, iHealth etc.).**

We will be checking documentation for every guest upon entry. Please present your vaccination card or negative PCR or Rapid Antigen test result. A photo result saved to your phone is sufficient.

When you arrive at the festival, get your COVID Safe wristband from the tent located next registration. All guests, participants, maestros, and volunteers must check in the COVID-19 tent to receive the wristband before picking up your registration packet at the Roosevelt High School Cafeteria or Sunnyside High School Theater Foyer.

ADDITIONAL FESTIVAL SAFETY PROTOCOLS

- Hand washing & sanitizing stations festival-wide
- Requirement of all staff and volunteers to be fully vaccinated or report a negative COVID test 48 hours prior to start date
- Regular and frequent cleaning of all high-touch surfaces, restrooms, and equipment

MASK GUIDELINES

- Masks are required for outdoor and indoor festival spaces. We advise all guests to wear a mask, for safety.
- If you have arrived and you are in need of a mask, please notify our volunteers, and we will provide you with a mask.
- Our maestros and vendors will be required to wear masks
- Masks MUST be worn in the following scenarios:
 - If you are not fully vaccinated
 - Waiting in line for registration packets, COVID-19 tent, showcases, etc.
 - Inside the Roosevelt High School Auditorium
 - In line at a food vendor or visiting booths
 - In classrooms while taking workshops
 - In restroom areas
 - Other scenarios where you might be unable to maintain a distance of at least 3 feet from people outside your household

REFUND POLICY

DUF 2022 REGISTRATION FEES ARE COMMITTED IMMEDIATELY TO THE EVENT AND ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.

If you are unable to attend the festival due to a positive test result for COVID, please send your documentation (registration receipt & positive COVID test result) along with a request for a full refund to Registration@danzantes.org.

PICKUP OF CREDENTIALS & VACCINATION WRISTBANDS

To minimize waiting on the day of the festival . . .

Please go to <https://myvaccinerecord.cdph.ca.gov/> . You can request a copy of your vaccine record to keep in your phone. Be prepared to show your vaccine record and valid ID.

Starting Friday, April 8th you can pick up your COVID-19 Wristbands in front of the registration pickup area located in the Roosevelt High School Cafeteria.

Pickup times for COVID wristbands and Festival badges are:

Friday, April 8: 4:00pm–8:00pm

Saturday, April 9th: 7am-12:00pm (Sunnyside High School Theater Foyer)

FAQs | VACCINATION

When is my last chance to get vaccinated?

We strongly encourage all guests to vaccinate fully against COVID-19. To be fully vaccinated in time for DUF 2022, you'll need to have received your second dose of the Moderna or Pfizer vaccine (or single dose of Johnson & Johnson vaccine) by March 25th (two weeks prior to the festival). If you are not yet vaccinated and would like to do so in time for the festival, please receive your first dose of the Moderna or Pfizer vaccine no later than March 4th, and your second dose of the Moderna or Pfizer vaccine (or single dose of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine) no later than March 25th.

FAQs | TESTING

Will the DUF Festival have testing on-site?

NO! We will not be providing testing on-site.

Do children need proof of vaccination or a negative test?

All attendees, including children of all ages, must have a negative COVID test within 48 hours of the festival or 24 hours if you are taking a Rapid Antigen Test or provide proof of vaccination. Children over the age of 5 are eligible to receive a vaccine.

What kind of COVID tests will be accepted?

The test must be a SARS-CoV-2 viral diagnostic test (NAAT- nucleic acid amplification test - PCR or Antigen Test), with the sample collected at a **Laboratory, Medical facility or Point-of-Care testing site**.

Home Testing Kit results will NOT be accepted.

What information must be included on the test result?

A test result must be in the form of written documentation (paper or electronic copy). The documentation must include:

1. Type of test (indicating it is a NAAT/PCR or Antigen test)
2. Entity issuing the result (e.g. laboratory, medical facility, or point-of-care testing site)
3. Specimen collection date. A negative test result must show the specimen was collected 48 hours (PCR test) or 24 hours (Antigen Test) before the festival.
4. Information that identifies the person (full name plus and date of birth)
5. Test Result

When do I need to take my COVID test?

The test must have been taken within 48 hours (PCR test) or 24 hours (Antigen test) of the festival.

If you are attending only on Saturday, you must take your test *no earlier* than Thursday, April 7th (PCR) or Friday, April 8th (Antigen Test) If you have additional questions regarding testing, please email Raul Gonzalez at COVIDsafe@danzantes.org

What happens if I test positive before the festival?

DUF 2022 registration fees are committed immediately to the event and are non-refundable.

If you are unable to attend the festival due to a positive test result for COVID within the 14 days preceding the event, please write to COVIDsafe@danzantes.org for details on how to request a partial or full refund.

Where do I need to wear a mask?

Through-out the festival including outdoor areas, masks MUST be worn inside classrooms while workshops are in progress, while not actively eating or drinking, at the Roosevelt High School Auditorium, and Staging Area.

Volunteer/ Staff REQUIREMENTS

DUF requires all Staff, vendors, and volunteers to be fully vaccinated or report a negative COVID test 48 hours prior to work.

All vendors will be required to:

- Post signage that encourages those who are unvaccinated to wear face masks
- Post signage to remind everyone who enters your booth that they should NOT enter if they have symptoms of COVID-19 or if they are under isolation or quarantine orders
- Provide hand-washing stations or hand sanitizer at your booth
- Establish procedures to prevent crowding and ensure distancing
- Require masks be worn by anyone working at your booth, regardless of vaccination status
- Recommend that those who will be in close contact with other people who may not be fully vaccinated should wear a higher level of protection, such as “double-masking” (wearing a cloth mask OVER a surgical mask) or a respirator (N95 mask)

Places that serve food and beverage are higher risk settings for transmission of COVID-19. In addition to above, all vendors that provide food and beverage must comply with the following:

- Recommend customers wear masks at concession stands if they are ordering or picking up food and/or beverages; provide masks at concession stands to those customers who are not masked
- Post signage informing patrons that they must wear masks when ordering or picking up food at food/beverage booths
- Encourage frequent handwashing by employees

DUF SHOWCASE BACKSTAGE REQUIREMENTS

- DUF will follow County of Fresno Guidelines
- All Staff & Volunteers will wear masks

- Dancers will wear a mask backstage; onstage we will leave to each Group Director the type of mask that will be used (face mask vs. face shield). However dancers must wear a face mask immediately following their performance.
- Hand sanitizers will be available in backstage areas

COVID-19 SAFETY ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to severe illness and death. There is an inherent and elevated risk of exposure to COVID-19 in any public place or place where people are present and there is no guarantee, express or implied, that those attending the festival will not be exposed to COVID-19. By attending Danzantes Unidos Festival, you expressly agree to comply with any and all rules and safety guidelines put in place by the event organizers, and voluntarily assume all risks related to exposure to COVID-19, waiving all claims and potential claims against the event organizers, and their affiliated companies relating to such risks.

DUF HEALTH PLEDGE

We ask that you not attend if any of the following is true for you or anyone in your party:

- Within 14 days before attending the festival you have tested positive or have been exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Within 48 hours prior to attending the festival, you have experienced symptoms of COVID-19 (e.g., a fever of 100.4°F or higher, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, chills, repeated shaking muscle pain/achiness, headache, sore throat, loss of taste or smell, nasal congestion, runny nose, vomiting, diarrhea, fatigue, or any other symptoms associated with COVID-19 identified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention);
- If you develop symptoms during the festival, please email COVIDsafe@danzantes.org for instructions. We ask if you develop symptoms to not attend the remainder of the festival.

Please be respectful to fellow guests, staff, volunteers, vendors, and performers who choose to maintain physical distancing from others.
